She oversaw the launch of a new initiative at United Way called Generation Impact aimed at engaging young

professionals in service, not just as donors, but also as volunteers. Courtney was promoted to Vice President shortly after her successful implementation of the Community Impact model, and ultimately was appointed President and CEO in 2019. Her evolving experience and capacity to engage community leaders continues to improve United Way's capacity to address the relevant issues in health, education and income stability. Courtney and her husband Robert live in DeLand with their four children.

In 2017, P. Barry Butler became the sixth president of Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, the world's leading institution of higher education focusing on aviation and aerospace. Under his presidency, Embry-Riddle continues to expand discovery-driven programs and its research park is home to new aerospace patents, technology transfer and startups. Dr. Butler has encouraged collaboration with industry, resulting in expedited hiring initiatives and partnerships with leading aviation and aerospace industries that have had a significant impact on the local economy and its employment base. Previously, he was Executive Vice President and Provost of the University of Iowa. Dr. Butler is a member of the Civic League of the Halifax Area, and is a private and glider pilot. He earned three degrees from the University of Illinois: a Bachelor's degree in Aronautical Engineering, a Master's degree in Astronautical Engineering, and a Ph.D. in Mechanical Engineering.
